## **Recent Events:**

**Village Precept meeting:** At the Village Precept Meeting held on 1st November there was a vote to use the remaining Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL), which stood at £1,009, on a dishwasher for the Village Hall. This money was the remaining CIL paid to the village as part of the Shepherd's Walk development. After the meeting a more cost-effective dishwasher was bought meaning that there is now a residual CIL fund of approximately £560.

This funding can be used for a wide range of projects e.g. play park repairs, village hall improvements, church repairs etc. or indeed any projects within the village you may be thinking of. If you have any ideas / proposals for projects within the village that this money could be spent on, then please email them to the Parish Clerk Jen Scarff (mutley177@gmail.com). Quotes would also be helpful. These can then be discussed and voted on at the April village meeting.

**Friday, 6<sup>th</sup> December – Artsreach:** Our first Artsreach production of the season will be "Lev's Violin" in the Village Hall from 7:30pm. Born with a beautiful sound but no name, Lev's violin was valued as worthless, although its origins remained a mystery. Many tales were attached to the violin, some true, some wonderfully untrue. Old and worn by its travels, it eventually broke a few years ago, and the instrument became the subject of a book by Helena Attlee and a BBC Radio 4 reading. It has since been through an extensive restoration and having passed through the hands of countless musicians, travelled continents and played the music of many cultures, it is now in the possession of violinist Greg Lawson.

Joined by accordionist Phil Alexander, come and follow the violins journey and hear some of the music from its past, ranging from Bach and Arvo Part to Armenian and Macedonian music. He's sold out shows across the world and regularly tours with John Cooper Clark and The Libertine. Luke Wright returns with a new set of poems that get to grips with the idea of JOY. The French novelist Henry de Montherlant said that "happiness writes white" but Wright's not exactly starting with a blank page. The poet writes urgently and warmly about family, fatherhood, and the joy of language itself. We might have to go down to come up, but we'll get there in the end.
