Recent Events:

Village Parish Meeting: This was held on 26th April in the Village Hall, where reports were given by the various associations, committees and clubs within the village, in addition to ideas being put forward on how to spend the remaining Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) money. Needle Felting Workshops – Dorset Falconry Park: A reminder of the Needle Felting Workshops being held by Coralie ("Cogs") McGown at Dorset Falconry Park.
